LAMDA AT BRABYNS

As part of our broader theatrical offering, we are now delighted to offer LAMDA (London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art) qualifications in Verse and Prose and in Acting.

LAMDA is a prestigious institution that is internationally recognised for its excellence in drama education. It provides a structured pathway for children to develop their artistic skills and gain recognition for their achievements.

New LAMDA qualifications for September:

INTRO

Year 1, 2 and 3

Develop confidence in speaking and listening by learning to recite poems and having structured conversations on a range of topics.

VERSE & PROSE

Year 4 and 5

Develop performance and communication skills by interpreting and delivering poems and extracts.

ACTING

Year 6

Develop acting skills, character analysis, improvisation and performing scripted material.

Who is LAMDA for?

LAMDA is perfect any child who would like to develop confidence communicating with an audience. Students will access an enjoyable, personalised approach to discovering their own voice.

What do sessions involve?

Classes enhance performance and communication skills in practical ways, paying attention to pronunciation, clarity and audibility. All classes build confidence and self-esteem. Children study the power of language, in the context of their texts and explore figures of speech such as alliteration and use of metaphor.

What is the cost of tuition?

Group lessons (4 or less) are £10 per week. One to one tuition is £16 per week. Sessions are 25 minutes, and will be timetabled to ensure the same classroom subject is not missed each week. Payment is due on a termly basis. Exams are optional to take however all classes will follow the syllabus. Annual exam fees are additional cost and rates vary depending on the level and grade taken.

Sessions are taught by Mrs Austin who holds a BA Hons in Theatre, Film and Television and a PGCE in Drama teaching. She has taught children from aged 4 to 19 in a variety of settings and has worked in the industry.



Lamda exams have a reputation for excellence worldwide, with later grades holding UCAS points and so are a useful springboard in preparation for university. All exams from the introductory level and up are rooted in encouraging a love of language and literature while developing the core skills for speaking, presenting and performing with both confidence and flair.
